

Moving around in Vienna

In Vienna you can use the Wiener Linien network which consists of underground trains, buses, trams and the S-Bahn (train).

You can purchase tickets at the airport, at any underground station and at a 'Trafik' (kiosk for newspapers and tobacco/cigarettes).

All tickets available for travel on the Wiener Linien network are valid on all means of public transport in Vienna.

The University of Vienna is situated next to the station "Schottentor". Schottentor has an underground line (U2), trams (1, 37, 38, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 71, D) and buses (1A, 40A).
